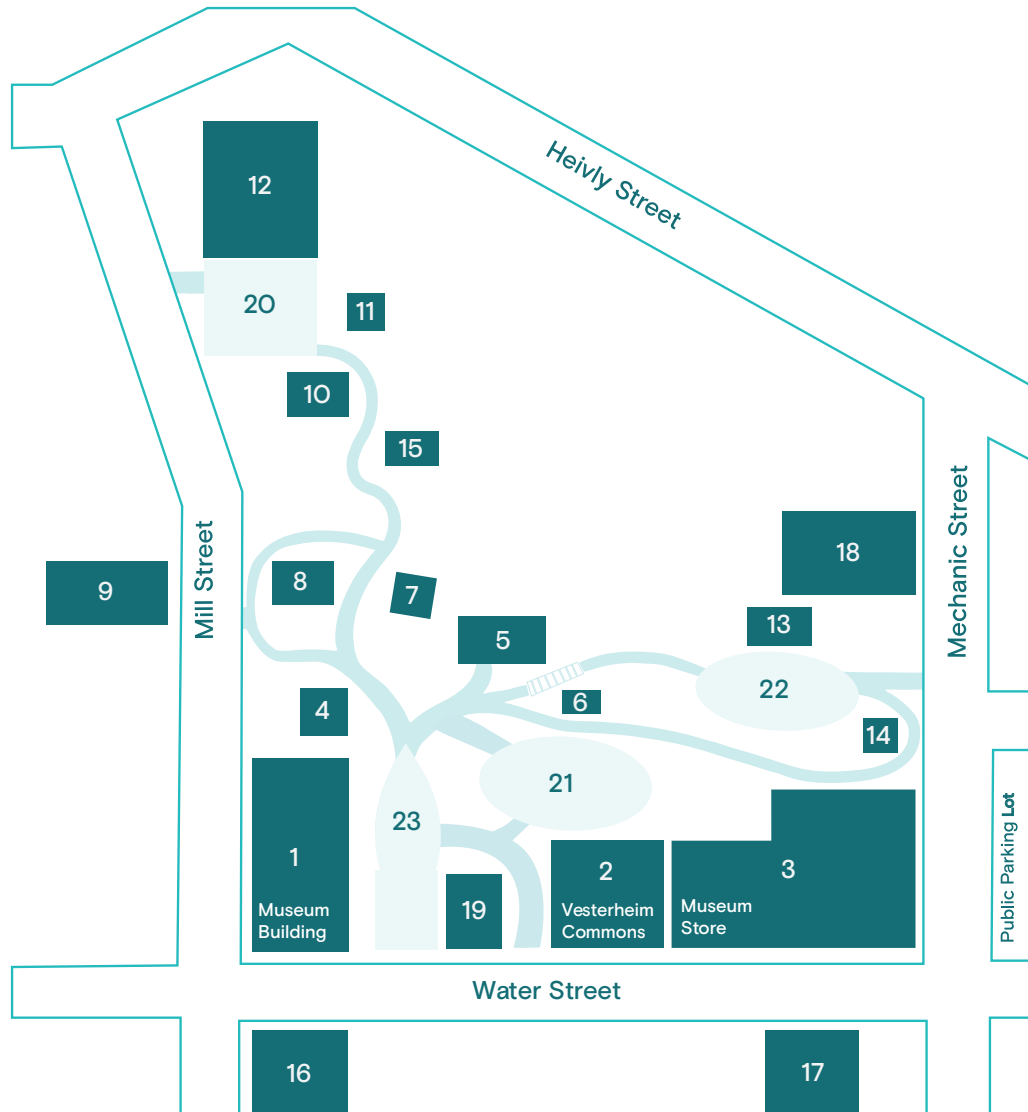


Vesterheim Campus

Vesterheim Main Building

In Vesterheim’s Main Building, start your visit in *The Home in Norway* and journey through *The Atlantic Crossing*, both on the first floor. On the second floor, find out how Norwegian immigrants built a new life in *The Home in America*. Explore Norwegian and Norwegian-American folk art on the second and third floors. Don’t forget to visit the basement for large-object open storage, *The Norwegian-American Press*, *Immigrant at Leisure*, and *Church Gallery*.
