2025 marks the 200th Anniversary of the first organized emigration of Norwegians to the United States! The single masted sloop, *Restauration*, left Stavanger on July 4, 1825, with 52 people on board. Often referred to as the “Sloopers,” they arrived in New York City harbor on October 9, 1825.

Vesterheim Folk Art School will commemorate this anniversary with programming inspired by the strong ties between Norway and the United States. Whether you have Norwegian roots or an interest in Scandinavian traditions, we invite you to join us in studying traditional handcraft and culture throughout the year!

Cultural Connections: Knitting

This winter, Vesterheim will launch the first series of cross-cultural webinars exploring traditional folk art techniques from multiple cultural perspectives. This first series is about stranded colorwork in knitting traditions around the world and will begin in early 2025 with webinars led by the Norwegian author and knitting designer Nina Granlund Saether; Dr. Angharad Thomas, an author, researcher, and knitter from the UK; and Diana Hendrickson, the Director of Special Events at the Centro de Textiles Tradicionales del Cusco in Peru.

The cross-cultural series webinars will foster perspective about the way Norwegian and Scandinavian handcrafts are part of a global community. We are excited about these programs and hope they create a forum for discussion around cultural practice and offer a platform for cultural exchange. The connections we make will help spread awareness of the folk art traditions we explore at Vesterheim. Join us as we learn together!

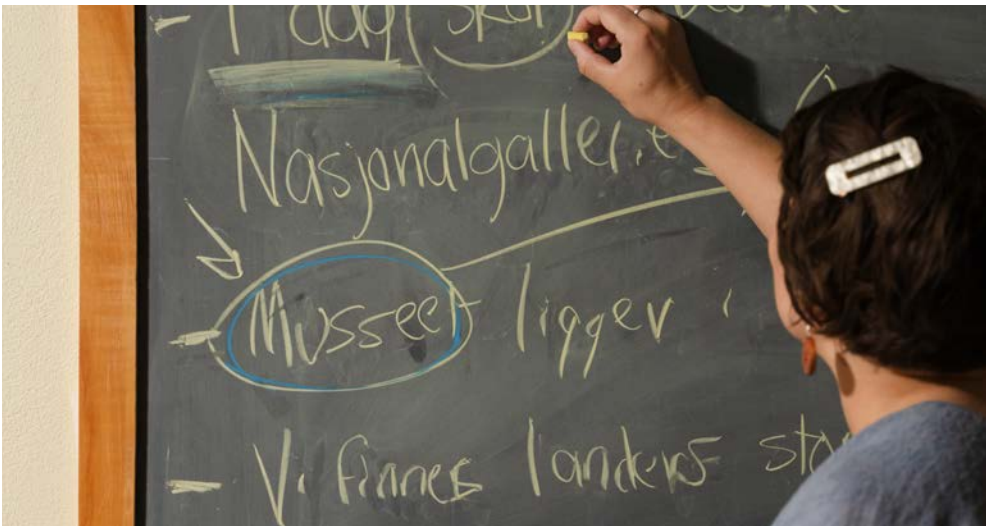

Coming Soon: On-Demand Classes

This summer, we began working on a new model for folk art instruction – on-demand classes. When you register for an on-demand class, Vesterheim will send you a kit of materials in the mail, and you'll have access for 90 days to a set of video tutorials taught by one of Vesterheim's master instructors. Designed to be classes that you can take anywhere at any time, we hope that the addition of on-demand classes can make Vesterheim's programming available to folks who have had schedule conflicts in the past.

We have filmed two classes so far, *Norwegian Language for Travelers* with Dr. Maren Anderson Johnson and *First Cuts: Scandinavian Flat-Plane Figure Carving* with Vesterheim Gold Medalist Charles Banks. Registration for these classes will launch in October 2024, and we have already begun conversations with instructors about teaching on-demand classes in rosemaking, weaving, jewelry, Nordic cooking, and more. We're excited about the possibilities this new model offers!

The Vesterheim Folk Art Apprenticeship Program is for individuals who intend to become handcraft teachers and are currently highly proficient in their craft. Apprentices participate in on-site group retreats, attend classes for free, and create a Vesterheim class proposal to teach.

The Folk Artist Residency Program is a professional development option that gives practicing folk art instructors the chance to explore Vesterheim's collection for object inspiration and future teaching.

The Study in Norway Instructor Professional Development Program is a professional development opportunity for practicing folk art instructors to travel to Norway to study, gain inspiration, and develop ideas for future teaching.

Scholarships

Vesterheim Folk Art School has a long reputation as a place that fosters community. Whether in our online or in-person programs, we strive to offer an inclusive space where people of diverse ages, backgrounds, and abilities can gather and celebrate handcraft traditions. Through story sharing, making, and learning as a community, we keep folk art alive and moving forward.

The Folk Art School offers several ways to provide better financial access for all. Scholarships are supported by gifts to the Vesterheim Annual Fund.

- The Emerging Artists Scholarship Program helps to cover the cost of tuition and materials to study folk art at Vesterheim. Any artist between the ages of 18-40 is eligible to apply.
- Need-based scholarships are designed as a pay-what-you-can model. We encourage anyone with financial need to apply.
- Vesterheim also offers a local waitlist option. On a space-available, standby basis, any year-round resident living within 50 miles of Vesterheim can receive a 60% discount for in-person class tuition. This standby option is also available to full-time enrolled Luther College students and members of the Oneota Weaver's Guild.

Vesterheim's Local Standby Class Discount for Winneshiek County Residents in 2024 is supported in part by a generous grant from the Depot Outlet.
