It was a year filled with an energetic exhibition schedule that explored topics from the distant past to contemporary times; a robust calendar of in-person and online classes and programs for all ages; rich travel experiences; and upgrades to the physical facilities, including tuckpointing on the Museum Building and renovating the new Forging Studio. Vesterheim also hosted a variety of guests, including local school students, summer tourists, and Viking River Cruise participants. We even welcomed a special visit from the President of Norway's Storting (parliament) for his first-ever trip to Decorah.

Other highlights in 2024 include the dedication event in November officially naming Hanson Vesterheim Commons in recognition of the generosity of Mary Jo (Hanson) Boman and the Hanson Family Foundation for their transformational gift of \$2 million for the Strong Roots | Bold Future, the Campaign to Grow Vesterheim. You will also learn more about the many prestigious awards Hanson Vesterheim Commons received in 2024.

Another important milestone that Vesterheim received in 2024 was re-accreditation from the American Alliance of Museums, a mark of distinction that speaks to the overall quality of the work done here on a daily basis.

Vesterheim has again achieved accreditation by the American Alliance of Museums, the highest national recognition afforded to the nation's museums. Vesterheim has been accredited since 1970. Of the nation's estimated 33,000 museums, only about 3% are currently accredited.

As the National Norwegian-American Museum and Folk Art School, Vesterheim explores the diversity of American immigration through the lens of the Norwegian-American experience, by sharing the over 33,000 objects and 12 historic buildings in its comprehensive collection that includes some of the most outstanding examples of decorative and folk art in the United States and inspires Vesterheim's global community of lifelong learners through exciting exhibitions, programs, and classes.



President Gharahkhani visits Vesterheim

On July 5, Vesterheim was pleased to welcome Masud Gharahkhani, Norway's President of the Storting (Parliament), for his first visit to Decorah. Vesterheim President/CEO Chris Johnson gave the delegation a tour of Vesterheim, and Chief Curator Laurann Gilbertson shared objects from the collection specifically related to Drammen, the area in Norway that President Gharahkhani comes from. Later in the year, participants in Vesterheim's Christmas Markets Tour to Norway were hosted by President Gharahkhani at the Norwegian Parliament.

Vesterheim was pleased to announce in 2024, that with an additional generous new gift, Mary Jo (Hanson) Boman and the Hanson Family Foundation have now contributed a total of \$2 million for Strong Roots | Bold Future, the Campaign to Grow Vesterheim. FOLK ART SCHOOL

In 2024, Vesterheim Folk Art School offered a full year of experiences including 57 in-person classes, 105 online classes and programs, and 21 youth and multigenerational programs in a wide array of Scandinavian folk arts, including rosemaling, woodworking, Norwegian language and culture, jewelry making, metal working, fiber arts, Nordic cooking, and more.

The Folk Art Apprentice Program selected five aspiring folk art instructors to learn from Vesterheim Gold Medalists and experienced instructors to help ensure continuity of Norwegian and Norwegian-American folk art traditions.

The Artist in Residence Program provided three practicing folk art instructors the opportunity to explore Vesterheim's collection for object inspiration and future teaching ideas.

Both programs were supported by the Dennis and Ruth Green Endowment for Folk Art Instructor Professional Development.

Additionally, two folk artists were selected to Study in Norway to learn, gain inspiration, and develop ideas for future teaching. Folk artist international study opportunities are supported by the John W. Kurtich Foundation Endowment. Vesterheim also welcomed two Norwegian instructors to campus with support from the Sigmund Aarseth Norwegian Instructor Endowment.
