We plan to publish classes every six months. The next registration will include classes from April-September 2026 and will open on February 20, 2026 (Noon CT).



National Exhibition

A special exhibition of contemporary folk art

Start thinking about the *The National Norwegian–American Folk Art Exhibition* in 2026! This summer exhibition at Vesterheim in Decorah, lowa, showcases the self–expression of contemporary artists who create folk art rooted in Norwegian traditions. Artists submit work for evaluation by a team of judges, who offer feedback on their pieces and award ribbons to the very best work. The ribbons carry points that accumulate toward a Vesterheim Gold Medal. There are also awards for Best of Show and People's Choice. The exhibition is for artists of all skill levels to share and grow in their ability.

The National Norwegian-American Folk Art Exhibition occurs every other year. All the information you need to enter will be listed online in the spring of 2026! We look forward to seeing your pieces and sharing your artwork at Vesterheim!

Past/Present/Future of Folk Art

On alternate years, Vesterheim presents a themed folk art show that is open to a wide range of artistic expression. The 2025 show is titled Past/Present/Future of Folk Art and is open through January 11, 2026.

Artists featured in this show have created pieces that honor folk art masters of the past, draw inspiration from contemporary culture bearers, and explore what folk art might become in the future. Many of these pieces will be for sale both in person and online at store.vesterheim.org. Be sure to visit Vesterheim to vote for People's Choice Award.

On-Demand Classes

Vesterheim Folk Art School has launched a new model for folk art instruction – on-demand classes. When you register for an ondemand class, Vesterheim sends you a kit of materials in the mail, and you have online access for 90 days to a set of video tutorials taught by one of Vesterheim's master instructors. Designed to be classes that you can take anywhere at any time, we hope that the addition of on-demand classes can make Vesterheim's programming available to folks who have had schedule conflicts in the past.



Scholarships

Vesterheim Folk Art School is a place that fosters community. Whether in online or in-person programs, we strive to offer an inclusive space where people of diverse ages, backgrounds, and abilities can gather and celebrate handcraft traditions. Through story sharing, making, and learning as a community, we keep folk art alive and moving forward.

The Folk Art School offers several ways to provide financial access for all. Scholarships are supported by gifts to the Vesterheim Annual Fund.

- The Emerging Artists Scholarship Program helps to cover the cost of tuition and materials to study folk art at Vesterheim.
 Any artist between the ages of 18-40 is eligible to apply.
- Need-based scholarships are designed as a pay-what-you-can model. We encourage anyone with financial need to apply.
- Vesterheim also offers a local waitlist option. On a spaceavailable, standby basis, any year-round resident living within 50 miles of Vesterheim can receive a 60% discount for in-person class tuition.
- In-person class tuition for full-time enrolled Luther College students and members of the Oneota Weaver's Guild is discounted 60% on a space available, standby basis.
